KARL ABRAHAM'S CRITERIA OF NEUROTIC DEPRESSION

1. DEPRESSED MOOD/ ANXIOUS MOOD

Present, proceed to 2 Absent, stop Possible Neurotic Depression PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

 2. FEELING OF HELPLESSNESS
 3. FEELING OF LOSS OF FEELINGS
 4. FEELING OF HOPELESSNESS
 5. LOSS OF DESIRE TO LIVE/ SUICIDAL TENDENCIES

At least 2 of 4 present, proceed to 6 Less than 2 of 4 present, stop Possible Neurotic Depression PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

6. PRECIPITATING FACTOR
7. DEPRESSIVE SYNDROME IN TEMPORAL CONNECTION WITH PRECIPITATING FACTOR

Both present, proceed to 8 Less than 2 present, stop

Probable Neurotic Depression PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

8. MANIA/ HYPOMANIA

Present, stop Absent, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER NEUROTIC DEPRESSION

It consists of a total number of 11 digits, based on 11 codes included in 8 variables organized into 4 decision clusters, yielding1 diagnosis.

It is based in Karl Abraham's paper entitled *Ansatze zur psychoanalytischen erforschung und behandlung des manisch-depressiven irreseins und verwandter zustande* published in *Zentralblatt für Psychoanalyse* in 1912 in which Neurotic Depression was described as depressed mood, precipitated by a factor, associated with feeling of being unloved and incapable of loving, despairs of life and future, and a tendency to deny life. In revised CODE-DD it is characterized by depressed mood (anxious mood), associated with feeling of helplessness, feeling of loss of feelings, feeling of hopelessness, loss of desire to live (or suicidal tendencies), with a temporal connection with a precipitating factor.
