SANDOR RADÓ'S DIAGNOSTIC CRITERIA OF DEPRESSIVE NEUROSIS

1. DEPRESSED MOOD

Present, proceed to 2 Possible Depressive Neurosis
Absent, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

- 2. FEELING OF INADEQUACY/ FEELING OF WORTHLESSNESS
- 3. SELF-INCRIMINATION

Both present, proceed to 4 Probable Depressive Neurosis Less than 2 present, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

4. MANIA/ HYPOMANIA

Present, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER
Absent, stop DEPRESSIVE NEUROSIS

It consists of a total number of 6 digits, based on 6 codes included in 4 variables organized into 3 decision clusters, yielding 1 diagnosis.

It is based on Sandor Radós paper entitled "The Problem of Melancholia" published in 1928 in the *International Journal of Psychoanalysis*, in which he described depressive neurosis as a depression with a fall of self-esteem and self-satisfaction with self-accusations and self-assertions. In revised CODE-DD depressive neurosis is characterized by depressed mood with feeling of inadequacy or worthlessness with self-incrimination.

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DEPRESSIVE NEUROSIS
