Absent, proceed to 4 Probable Melancholia

Present, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

4. MANIA/ HYPOMANIA

Present, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER

Absent, stop MELANCHOLIA

It consists of a total number of 13 digits, based on 13 codes included in 4 variables organised into 4 decision clusters, yielding to 1 diagnosis.

It is based on the Corpus Hippocraticum written between 460-370 BC, as translated from the Greek original into English by F. Adams in his "Genuine Works of Hippocrates," published in 1929, in which melancholia referred to all kinds of chronic mental disturbances. In revised CODE-DD melancholia is characterised by agitation (anxious mood, delusions, depressed mood, hallucinations, hypochondriasis or incoherence) with prolonged duration, in the absence of epilepsy, hysteria and Scythian disease.
