8. MANIA/ HYPOMANIA

Present, stop Absent, stop PSYCHIATRIC DISORDER SIMPLE MELANCHOLIA

It consists of a total number of 15 digits, based on 15 codes included in 8 variables organized into 3 decision clusters, yielding 1 diagnosis.

It is based on Theodor Meynert's *Lehrbuch der Psychiatrie*, published in 1884, in which simple melancholia is one of the three diseases of the category of cortical irritative processes. While Meynert gave no clear-cut definition of simple melancholia, in revised CODE-DD simple melancholia is characterized by depressed mood with anhedonia (apathetic indifference), desire to die (loss of desire to live or suicidal tendencies), dysphoria, motor retardation (retarded thinking or stupor), misanthropy (withdrawal) and tearful.
