### Basle 1960

Rothlin was – unique in the history of CINP a second time the CINP-President and (together with several as members of university hospitals and institutes as scientists of Basle pharmaceutical industry) the local organizer and the host of the so-called "closed meeting". The first executive committee had decided already before the Rome Congress a succession of "open" and "closed" meetings. Allowed to attend those meetings should be only ordinary members of CINP and an additional scientist, personally invited by an ordinary member. Therefore the number of participants in Basle was limited to 250.

The Munich Congress was an open meeting. The consequence was that – besides basic scientists – especially clinical psychiatrists and psychologists to attended the meeting. President was Paul Hoch – a clinician and at this time commissioner for Mental Health State of New York. Paul Hoch, born in Hungary, partially trained in Germany was a very prominent US psychiatrist and had published (together with L.B. Kalinowsky – a German psychiatrist, who left Germany 1933 and came over Rome, Paris and London to USA) the standard book on somatic treatments in psychiatry in the era before psychotropic drugs.





Bente had organized (together with the so-called "Fünfergruppe" already 1959 a "Deutsche Arbeitsgemeinschaft für Neuropsychopharmakologie" (AGNP) arranged (since 1960 up to now) scientific meetings in Nürnberg. AGNP was the first national society for neuropsychopharmacology and had the authority by CINP executive committee to function as "Lokales beratendes Comité des CINP".

Under the presidency of H.E. Lehmann and under the impression of the hopeful "Prague Springtime" the Executive Committee decided 1968 to arrange the VII CINP Congress in Prague. It was a spectecular and very effective effort of Z. Votava together with O. Vinar and M. Voitechovsky to realize the CINP Congress - in spite of all the serious problems happened in Czechoslowakia since 1969.


**Paris 1974**






